It was with sadness that we had to close our churches on account of the present pandemic: a sad decision but a necessary one. So, more than ever, your homes can be the 'domestic churches' that are part of the wider Church. Financial Questions

Before the churches closed, a number of people asked about how to continue making their offering to the parish. In fact, because of people's generosity in the past, the parish can cope without collections for the time being (not all parishes are in that lucky position). Instead, if you can afford to, you could use your offerings to bring the Church to the community at large: maybe there is a neighbour who could do with a hand; or you could support a local charity or organisation (such as Kilbryde Hospice); or you could make an extra offering to SCIAF.
