Reflection on the Readings

Why does God allow evil to exist? Parable one today suggests that destruction of evil may also cause destruction of good. God alone must make the final judgement on who and what is good or evil. Next come two parables about the growth of the kingdom of God. Farmers saw the mustard plant as a nuisance, and yeast was considered a corrupting force in bread-making. Christians are still often seen as a corrupting influence and a nuisance!

Re-opening for Mass

We have now been given the go ahead to open for Mass with restrictions, specifically:

- No more than 50 people per Mass
- The contact details of all those attending must be retained by the parish (in order to contact people in the event of an outbreak)
 - Face coverings, sanitising and social distancing still apply
 - There must be no singing (not even the priest!)

We therefore are going to have to apply a booking system for Mass. This may seem awkward, but it is the best way to fulfil our obligations to keep people safe. The obvious drawback is that not everyone has the internet. It is therefore *up to you* to support relatives and fellow parishioners in doing this.

If anyone wishes to volunteer, your phone number could be made available and you could book places for others to come to Mass.

Masses will be at the usual times (Sat 5pm, Sun 10am, 11.30am & 5pm). If a Mass fills up, you can try for another. In the first instance, there will be availability to book for the next 3 weeks, but please try to leave space for others. It will take time, but we will get there!

If this doesn't work, we can try another way. In the short term, if someone phones St Mark's, I can book them online as well.

Masses will only be at the weekend (starting with the 5pm Vigil). There will be no weekday Masses at first.
