Reflection on the Readings

Jesus is alone in an unknown village. A leper does the unthinkable (and illegal!) in approaching Jesus, saying "if you want to, you can cure me". Jesus replies "of course I want to". Then Jesus does the unthinkable: he touches the leper. Under the law, Jesus now takes on the condition of the leper, who is now clean. This is an indication of what Jesus' death will mean: changing places with sinful humanity.

Praying the Psalms (Psalm 31/32)

Today's psalm begins 'Happy the man whose fault is forgiven'. This would be a great psalm to pray before Lent: ask God for the courage to open your heart to your need for his forgiveness. What are the sins you keep hidden deep down? In the embrace of God's love and mercy, you can face them head on and then pray this psalm of faith in God's forgiveness.

Ash Wednesday

I would invite you to offer up the sacrifice of not receiving ashes this year. And furthermore, turn it into an opportunity for grace: ask God to help you find ways to compensate for the lack of that most obvious visual reminder of penance by finding other ways to give witness.

We will celebrate two Masses. The schoolchildren have been encouraged to follow the morning Mass, so it will be directed to them. Masses will be at 10am and 7pm.

National Day of Prayer for those who have suffered Abuse

Friday is the national Day of Prayer for Those who have Suffered Abuse, and you are invited to join your prayers with those of the Catholic Church throughout Scotland for people in our families and communities who carry within themselves the deep and traumatic wounds of abuse in any way inflicted by members of the Church. Prayers at Mass on Friday will reflect this.

Online Children's Mass

There will be another children's Mass at 10am next Sunday. The children are again invited to send in messages to be read out. In addition, if any want to record short prayers (like bidding prayers) these can be included.
