## THE MEMORIAL OF ST JOHN CHRYSOSTOM

St John Chrysostom, Bishop and Doctor of the Church, 347-407, one of the four great Greek Doctors, the 'golden -mouthed' preacher, was Archbishop of Constantinople. He incurred much opposition and died in exile. Patron saint of preachers.

#### THE FEAST OF THE EXALATION OF THE HOLY CROSS

The Feast of the **Exaltation of the Holy Cross** originally commemorated the dedication of Constantine's Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem. The remains of the cross that St Helena had recently discovered were venerated there the following day.

#### THE FEAST OF ST NINIAN

St Ninian was born in Cumbria about the year 360 and was ordained Bishop in 394 in Rome, probably by Pope Siricius. He landed in Whithorn in 397 and built a church called Candida Casa (White House). This church was a centre from which he and his disciples preached the Gosepl in Scotland, South-East of the Highland line. He dies about 432 and was buried in Whithorn.
