St Thérèse of the Child Jesus (or of Lisieux), Virgin and Doctor of the Church. Born at Alcençon in France, in 1873, Thérèse entered the Lisieux Carmelite Monastery as a young airl. Battling physical weakness and psychological vulnerability, she practised the virtues of humility, gospel simplicity and a firm confidence in God. Her "Little Way" means taking God at his word and letting his live for us wash away our sins and imperfections. She died in 1897 and was canonised in 1925.
