Blessed John Dunn Scotus, Priest, was born around 1265 in Duns, Berwickshire, and entered the Order of Franciscans Minor in Dumfries. He was educated in Oxford and taught at the University of Paris. He had a considerable influence on medieval theology and philosophy, and was styled the Doctor Subtilis (Subtle Doctor) for the clarity of his thinking. He died in 1308 in Cologne.
