# REAL CHRISTMAS GIFTS: WATER FOR A VILLIAGE

As Pope Francis teaches us in his 2015 Encyclical Laudato Si, "the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor" are inextricably linked. During November, we saw the world come to Glasgow for COP26 to decide on action on tackling Climate Change. Pope Francis recognises that we all share responsibility. "We need to strengthen the conviction that we are all money single family. There are no frontiers or barriers, political or social, behind which we can hide."

A parish group has been meeting during COP26 to consider what action we could take as a parish. One of the suggestions was that we could donate through SCIAF to provide a Real Christmas Gift of a well for an entire community, which costs £1088. There will be a second collection for this on Gaudate Sunday, the third Sunday of Advent.
