### SUNDAY 2ND JANUARY

*The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the LORD: The annual telling of the Epiphany story could have us take it all for granted: magi from far-away places, guided only by a star, fabulously rich and so on. However, they were gentiles, outsiders, detested by all! Yet they sought out the New-born King when King Herod's religious advisors—who knew all the prophesies about he king being born in Bethlehem—make no move to go and see this wonderful deed of the LORD. Their gifts recognise that the Christ-Child is God (frankincense); that he is a king (gold); that he has come to die for us (myrrh).*
