THE FEAST OF ST JOHN

St John was one of the three Apostles, along with his brother St James (the Greater) and St Peter, whom Our Lord took with Him on special occasions. Jesus nicknamed him and James 'Boanerges' (Sons of Thunder). He may be the "Beloved Disciple" of the Fourth Gospel who was present at the crucifixion and to whom Jesus commended His Mother; with St peter he ran to the tomb where "he saw and he believed". The Book of Revelation and three letters in the New Testament are attributed to him. He exile to the island of Patmos and other punishments for preaching

Christ but, by tradition, he did not die a martyr's death.

THE MEMORIAL OF ST THOMAS BECKET

St Thomas Becket (1118-1170) served King Henry II of England as Lord Chancellor then Archbishop of Canterbury. Following his installation St Thomas adopted an ascetic lifestyle and, overnight became a staunch defender of the rights of the Church. This led to bitter conflict with the King and a period of exile. He had hardly eturned after a truce had been brokered when some knights, interpreting the king's displeasure, murdered him in his cathedral in 1170.
