We will always be grateful that he spent his years of "retirement" with us, and we will always pray for the repose of his soul. May he Rest in Peace.



THE FEAST OF ST PATIRCK

He was fearless in facing opposition from powerful pagan rulers; he practised regular penance which became a strong feature of Irish monasticism; he instilled a missionary spirit which has lasted to the present day.
