THE MEMORIAL OF ST IRENAEUS

St Irenaeus (130-200) came from Smyrna, present-day Izmir, Turkey, where the bishop was St Polycarp, one of the last to have known St John, the longest-surviving Apostle. Irenaeus emphasised the importance of the unbroken succession of bishops since the time of the Apostles to guarantee of orthodox teaching. Following the trade routes to southern France he became a missionary at Lyon, now to primatial see of France. He was its second bishop. He was instrumental in undoing the influence of the Gnostic heresy. Tradition says he died a martyr about the year
