MONDAY 8TH AUGUST

THE MEMORIAL OF ST DOMINIC

St Dominic was born c.1170 in Calaruega in Old Castile. Domingo Guzman. Studied at Palencia and, having a reputation for piety and learning, was made canon of the church at Osma in 1193. His bishop took him on a political mission to the south of France; there he travelled from place to place, working tirelessly and especially preaching conversion to the people who had become, to a great extent, followers of the heresy of Albigensianism. He continued this work for ten years and, gradually gathering companions around him, the first house of The Order of Preachers ("the Dominicans") was established. In 1215, Dominic took part in the Fourth Lateran Council and, in the following year, the Order received papal approval. Subsequently, the Order adopted additional rules of prayer and poverty and thus became strict mendicants. The Order spread very successfully in Europe; there were sixty houses when the founder died in 1221.

TUESDAY 9TH AUGUST

THE FEAST OF ST TERESA BENEDICTA OF THE CROSS

St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, Virgin and Martyr, a Co-Patron of Europe. Born in 1891 of Jewish parents in Breslau, Germany, (now Wroclaw, Poland), Edith Stein was a brilliant student who gained her doctorate in philosophy aged 25. She converted to Catholicism aged 31 and became a Carmelite nun in 1934. Being Jewish, she fled to the Netherlands when the Nazis came to power in Germany but, following the German invasion of the Low Countries in 1940, she was seized by the Nazis and sent to Auschwitz concentration camp. She died there in the gas chamber on 9th August 1942.

WEDNESDAY 10TH AUGUST

THE FEAST OF ST LAWRENCE

A much venerated and very popular saint in Rome, Lawrence, was a deacon who assisted Pope Sixtus II. He is said to have been born at Huesca in Spain c. 226 and was martyred in Rome during the persecution of 258. Devotion to the saint has produced several stories, especially of his important work in Rome and of his behaviour at his execution. The tradition is that he was roasted to death on a gridiron and that, on it, he asked to be turned over 'to do the other side'. His tomb is in the basilica named after him.

THE MEMORIAL OF ST CLARE

St Clare (1293-1353) was the daughter of wealthy parents in Assisi, and was attracted by the life and teaching of St Francis. She spent some time with him and his group but then, in 1212, she founded her own woman's Franciscan group, usually known as the Poor Clares. They were to live lives of poverty, austerity and prayer. As their leader, Clare lived at the little church of San Damiano, just outside Assisi.

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

SATURDAY 13TH AUGUST

Traditional in the Church for many centuries, the Doctrine of Mary's Assumption was solemnly defined by Pope Pius XII before a huge crowd in St Peter's Square on 1st November 1950: "...The Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin ... was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory ... as Queen over all things..."

There is no Scriptural account of this event. The two Gospels, from the Vigil and the Day masses both focus o the honour due to Mary as the one chosen to the Mother of God and who accepted God's choice. She is the ultimate disciple, who treasures God's word in her heart, and she is the one for whom God has done great things, raising up his servant in her lowliness.
