TUESDAY 13TH SEPTEMBER

THE MEMORIAL OF ST JOHN CHRYSOSTOM

St John Chrysostom (347-407) The adjective 'Chrysostom' by which he was known means 'golden mouthed', i.e. eloquent. He trained as an advocate but, after six years as a monk, took holy orders—deacon, priest and, in 398, archbishop of Constantinople. He built hospitals, reformed the clergy, sent monks to be missionaries and, for criticising the vices of rulers, was deposed and banished in 403. Still in exile, he died four years later. He was reburied honourably in Constantinople in 418. Recognised as an outstanding orator, he also wrote homilies, commentaries on the Scripture, letters and a number of theological treatises. St John Chrysostom is one of the four great Doctors of the Eastern Church.

THE FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS & A DAY OF PRAYER FOR UKRAINE

The feast of the **Exaltation of the Holy Cross** was instituted for the dedication in 335 of the Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem, built by the Emperor Constantine. In it was placed the Holy Cross, discovered by the Emperor's mother, St Helena.

THE MEMORIAL OF OUR LADY OF SORROWS

Devotion to **Our Lady of Sorrows** is centuries old; the present liturgical feast was instituted in the 19th century. The seven Sorrows (sometimes called 'Dolours') are Simeon's Prophecy—Flight to Egypt-Loss of the Temple-Meeting on way to Calvary-At the Cross-Jesus taken down-His burial.

THE FEAST OF ST NINIAN

St Ninian was born in Cumbria about the year 360 and was ordained Bishop in 394 in Rome, probably by Pope Siricius. He landed in Whithorn in 397 and built a church called Candida Casa (White House). This church was a centre from which he and his disciples preached the Gospel in Scotland, South East-of the Highland line. He died about 432 and was buried in Whithorn.

SATURDAY 17TH SEPTEMBER

THE MEMORIAL OF ST HILDEGARD OF BINGEN

St Hildegard of Bingen (1098-1179) was a German Benedictine Abbess and polymath active as a writer, composer, philosopher, mystic and visionary. She is one of the best known composers of sacred monophony, and more chants survive by Hildegard than by any other composer from the Middle Ages, and she is one of the few known composers to have written both the music and the words. Hildegard's other works include volumes on visionary theology, a musical morality play, an extensive collection of letters, and manuscripts of sermons she preached. Pope Benedict XVI named her a Doctor of the Church in 2012 and in 2021 Pope Francis inserted her Optional Memorial into the Universal Calendar.
