THE MEMORIAL OF ST TERESA OF CALCUTTA

St Teresa of Calcutta (1910-1997) Born Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu in Skopje, Albania, her father died when she was nine years old. Moved to be a missionary Agnes entered the Sisters of Loreto in Ireland, and departed from Calcutta in 1929. She taught for a number of years, and, as a result of mystical experiences, Teresa felt called by Christ to establish a religious community, Missionaries of Charity, dedicated to the service of the poorest of the poor. Teresa and her sisters reached out to the poor with love on the streets of Calcutta wearing the distinctive, blue-trimmed white sari. The Missionaries of Charity are active in every continent. Mother Teresa was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1979. She was canonised by Pope Francis in 2016

THE FEAST OF THE NATIVITY OF OUR LADY

The feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary is celebrated nine months after the solemn feast of her Immaculate Conception. Mary's birth is recorded, not in Sacred Scripture but in the second century Protoevangelium of James which adds her parents' names as Anne and Joachim. In Jerusalem, near the Pool of Bethseda, there is a beautiful 5th Century church of St Anne, reputed to be perhaps Mary's birthplace.
