THE MEMORIAL OF ST IGNATIUS OF ANTIOCH

St Ignatius of Antioch (c.35-c.107) is thought to have been a disciple of St John, and was the second Bishop of Antioch. On his way to Rome (and martyrdom), he wrote some letters which are extant; they extol the importance of the office of a bishop and warn against Judaism and Docetism (which holds that the human form of Jesus was mere semblance, with no true reality).

St Luke was the writer of the Gospel and of the Acts of the Apostles. He was a companion of St Paul (on his second missionary journey) and is called by him 'the beloved physician' (Col 4:14). There is a further mention of him with Paul in Rome (2Tim 4:11). He is thought to have been native of Antioch in Syria and to have been an artist. Details of his death (as a martyr?) are unknown.

SATURDAY 22ND OCTOBER

THE MEMORIAL OF ST JOHN PAUL II

St John Paul II (1920-2005), was born Karol Woijtyla in Wadowice in Poland. He was ordained in 1946, and became a Professor of Moral Theology at the Universities of Lublin and Cracow. He was appointed Archbishop of Cracow in 1964, and then created Cardinal in 1967, and then elected Pope in 1978, the first non-Italian in 450 years. As Pope, he made more than one hundred apostolic visits, including his visit to Scotland in 1982. He wrote books, poems and a play in his earlier years, and when he became Pope a number of important documents: encyclicals letters, apostolic exhortations, instructions and motu proprio letters. He survived an assassination attempt

by a gunman during a general audience in St Peter's Square on the 13th of May 1981. In later years he suffered from Parkinson's disease, but remained as active as possible until his death.
