THE MEMORIAL OF ST CHARLES BORROMEO

St Charles Borromeo (1538-1584) was born at his father's castle on Lake Maggiore in the north of Italy. With family influence, he became Cardinal Archbishop of Milan when aged 21. Nevertheless, he was a splendid churchman, influential in the success of the Council of Trent, he also drew up the Council's official 'Roman Catechism', was renowned as a reformer in the archdiocese and internationally in defence of the faith. He founded seminaries in Milan, sought good religious education in schools and was very active during the famine of 1570 and
