THE MEMORIAL OF ST JOHN XXIII

St John XXIII, Pope, 1881-1963. Prior to his election to the Holy Sea as apostolic visitator, apostolic delegate and nuncio, he ministered in Bulgaria, Turkey and Greece, and Paris, concerning himself with the problems of the Eastern Churches and assisting in France in the Church's post-war efforts. Within three months of his election to the See of Peter he announced the convocation of an ecumenical council for the universal Church, the Second Vatican Council.

THE MEMORIAL OF ST TERESA OF JESUS

St Teresa of Avila (1515-1582), also known as Teresa of Jesus, was born in Avila, and became a Carmelite nun there. Chosen as mother general of all Carmelite communities internationally, she reformed their rule, established many new convents, was a mystic and contemplative who was also highly active and practical, travelling often to visit convents throughout Spain besides writing much on spirituality and prayer. She died in Alba de Tormes, near Salamanca.
