THE FEAST OF ST MARGARET OF SCOTLAND

St Margaret, Queen of Scotland (c. 1045-1093) is the second patron of Scotland and was born in Hungary to an exiled family, who when they returned to England, had to flee to Scotland. Young and pious, she married King Malcolm III at Dunfermline; they had eight children. Noted for her generosity to the poor and recognised for her exemplary way of life as wife and mother, she also worked to bring the old Celtic Church into the mainstream of the Church in the rest of Europe.

THE MEMORIAL OF ST ELIZABETH OF HUNGARY

St Elizabeth of Hungary (1007-1031) at). The daughter of Andreas II of Hungary, was betrothed aged four, married Louis IV of Thuringia when aged fourteen, bore three children, widowed when twenty (her husband dying while on crusade). Accused of wasting the state's wealth by her charity to the poor, she was deprived of the regency and exiled. She lived in a convent for a tine, then retired to a cottage. Throughout her life, she was noted
