**St Cecilia** is venerated as a virgin and martyr of Rome. In the second or third century she refused to worship the pagan gods and was beheaded. In the Trastevere church of Santa Cecilia, there is a recumbent sculpture of the martyr with three fingers extended, still proclaiming the Christian doctrine of the Holy Trinity; this image reproduces how her body was found when the tomb was opened in 1599

#### **SEASON OF ADVENT**

In Advent the Church prepares to celebrate the Nativity, when we recall Christ's first coming. As we remember we also look forward in faith to his Second Coming at the end of time. It is a period of joyful hope. The hopes of Advent is expressed during the first part of Advent with the concentration of the Second Coming while the first coming is recalled particularly from the 17th December, when Christ is seen as the fulfilment of the hope of Israel. Throughout Advent, violet (purple) is used for seasonal celebrations. The use of flowers and musical instruments should be restrained until Christmas. The Gloria is normally prayed during Advent.

We also begin a New Liturgical Year, Year A, and since its year A, so does the three-year liturgical calendar.

## THE 1ST SUNDAY OF ADVENT (A)

Next week the first words of the entire lectionary are proclaimed with the words "The vision of Isaiah...": a vision for people to turn swords into ploughshares, spears into pruning hooks—destructive implements into creative tools. Advent is a season of hope, of positive expectation. Our challenge is to bring about this hope, this peace.
