TUESDAY 8TH NOVEMBER

THE MEMORIAL OF BLESSED JOHN DUNS SCOTUS

Blessed John Duns Scotus (c.1265-1308) was born in Duns in Berwickshire and joined the Franciscan Friars Minor. He was sent to study at the University of Oxford and to teach at the University of Paris. He had considerable influence on the philosophy and theology of his day, being known as Doctor Subtilis. In particular, he taught the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, viz. conceived without original sin, using the argument potuit, decuit, ergo fecit (it was possible, it was fitting, therefore it was accomplished). Sent to teach in Cologne, he died there.

WEDNESDAY 9TH NOVEMBER

THE FEAST OF THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA

The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica Following the Emperor Constantine's granting freedom of worship to the Catholic Church in 313, the church was built beside the palace of the Laterani family and consecrated in 324. This Church is the Cathedral of the diocese of Rome and, until 1309, the popes lived nearby. Its original dedication is to the Most Holy Saviour; in the Middle Ages, the names of St John the Baptist and St John the Evangelist were added (thus a common name now is 'St John Lateran'). The basilica bears the description: 'Omnium Urbis et Orbis terrarium Mater et Caput' (Of All the Churches in the City and in the World, this Mother and Head). This feast was extended worldwide to the whole Church in 1565.

THURSDAY 10TH NOVEMBER

THE MEMORIAL OF ST LEO THE GREAT

St Leo the Great (c. 390-461) was from a prominent Roman family; he was eminent as pope (and thus is called Leo the Great). To the ecumenical council of Chalcedon meeting near Constantinople in 451, he sent his 'Dogmatical Letter' which declared that Christ, in his one divine person, had two natures, human and divine (called the hypostatic union). The following year, he met Atilla the Hun and persuaded him to abandon the invasion of the Italian peninsula. Leo is one of the great Doctors of the Church in Western Europe.

THE MEMORIAL OF ST MARTIN OF TOURS

St Martin of Tours (316-397) was born in Pannonia (Germany) and was a soldier in the army of the Roman Empire. Later, he was a disciple of Hilary of Poitiers and founded a monastery near there, before being dragged forcibly to become bishop of Tours. He was famed for his holiness and accounts of miracles.

THE MEMORIAL OF ST JOSAPHAT

St Josaphat (1580-1623) lived in eastern Europe (present day Ukraine area) where there was a great rivalry and often violence between those who were faithful to Rome and those who were Orthodox Christians. Josaphat was bishop of Polotsk and his life was frequently marked with dissension, rivalry and fighting. Eventually he was

brutally murdered and is honoured as a martyr. (Readings: 3 John 5-8; Psalm 111; Luke 18:1-8)
