Only on the last Sunday of Advent do we ever have an infancy narrative story in the Gospel; this year we have Matthew's 'annunciation' - to Joseph, rather than to Mary. THE SEASON OF CHRISTMASTIDE

Preceded only in importance by the celebration of the Paschal Mystery, the Church has no more ancient a tradition than the celebration of the Christmas Season: from Jesus' humble birth in Bethlehem; the announcement of his birth to the Shepherds by Angels; the revelation to the Magi and their subsequent adoration of the child; his Baptism in the River Jordan and the Father's declaration of Jesus as "Beloved Son" and the beginning of his public ministry. The other feasts of Christmastime (St Stephen, St John the Evangelist, the Holy Innocents, the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God) all have an intimate connection to the Lord's manifestation.
