SATURDAY 7TH JANUARY

The Gospel narrative and the text of Isaiah together shape our traditional crib scene of kings, camels and lavish gifts. But the feast celebrates revelation itself. The Wise Men's search, guided by the light of Reason takes them only so far. Only an encounter with Scripture—Divine revelation—can perfect it, and lead them to find and worship the divine child. Our human capacities need to be enlightened by divine revelation to lead us to God and to Christ, the light which enlightens all of life.

THE FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Christmas ends with the adult Jesus' Baptism. Christmas is the celebration of the Saviour coming to Earth. Mostly, the emphasis is on human acceptance (or rejection) of the Saviour. Now, Jesus accepts his destiny as the Saviour. Baptism means 'immersion'. In baptism, the adult Jesus immerses himself in the Father's will. Hence God's voice: This is my son, the Beloved"; hence the Spirit is uncharacteristically present in a visible form—the dove. The entire Trinity is present.

THE FEAST OF ST KENTIGERN

St Kentigern (518-603). His mother, St Enoch, was a Lothian princess who became pregnant because she was raped. Her father had her cast off into the Firth of Forth in a coracle, She landed on the opposite shore at St Serf's monastic school at Culross. It was he who nicknamed him Mungo. He became the first Bishop of Glasgow. He was forced out by pagan opponents and spent some time in England and Wales. He returned to spend many more years preaching the Word and praising his Name.

PROJECT GAMBIA


