	THE SEASON OF LENT			

**7TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (A)** 

Lent is a time of preparation for Easter. The Lenten liturgy disposes the faithful, catechumens and candidates to celebrate the Paschal mystery as the centre of the liturgical year and of the Christian life. Violet is the colour of the season. The season was originally devised as a period of catechesis for those becoming members of the Church at Easter. The Sunday Readings (original version in Cycle A) are dominated by truths of faith (Sundays 1 & 2) and Baptismal Themes (3, 4 & 5). Weekday Readings have the theme of an encounter inviting change.

Flowers are not used and musical instruments are only used to support singing. The Te Deum and Gloria are omitted except on Solemnities and the Gloria is sung or said on Feasts.

#### ASH WEDNESDAY A DAY OF FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

#### WEDNESDAY 22ND FEBRUARY

The words that accompany the imposition of ashes on our foreheads at mass are very similar to the words of the priest holding a handful of earth at the graveside: "for we are dust, and unto dust we shall return"; we are reminded of our mortality, and thus our need for God.

# THE COMMEMORATION OF SAINT POLYCARP

**St Polycarp (69-156)** was a disciple of St John the Apostle, who made him Bishop of Smyrna, one of the seven churches of St John's Apocalypse. He visited Rome to consult with Pope Anicetus showing an early sign of respect for the successor of St Peter. Shortly after returning he was arrested by officials of the Roman Empire. They burned him to death in the city stadium, at the age of 87.
