FOODBANK

PENITENTIAL ACT

There are three forms of the Penitential Act that we can use at Mass and we frequently use two of them: form 1 & form 3. During Lent we will begin to use form two, so that we are comfortable with all three forms. The second form is prayed as follows:

Priest: Have mercy on us, O Lord.
People: For we have sinned against you.
Priest: Show us, O Lord, your mercy.
People: And grant us your salvation.

SCIAF LENTEN APPEAL

This year's Lenten appeal focuses on the lives of families in Zambia. It tells stories of women and the things they do to overcome the challenges they face, of the work of our partners and of the distance that SCIAF supporters' generosity goes.

It deals with the practicalities of farming in the harshest of conditions and the problems that families face when their crops fail and there is nothing for them to eat.

For families in Zambia, going hungry is just the start of their problems but it does not have to be the end of their lives.

A representative from SCIAF will be here to talk to us about this appeal, and we will take up a second collection to aid their work on the **Fourth Sunday of Lent (18t/19th March).**

THE FEAST OF SAINT JOHN OGILVIE

St John Ogilvie, Martyr, was born in 1580 at Drum, near Keith. Educated a Calvinist, he went to the Low Countries and was received into the Catholic Church by Father Cornelius a Lapide. He became a Jesuit, was ordained priest in 1613 and landed in Scotland that year. In Edinburgh and Glasgow he reconciled many to the Ancient Faith, but was betrayed, imprisoned and tortured, and finally hanged in Glasgow in 1615.

RCIA

On the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent, our newly named "Elect" will participate in three successive rites called "the Scrutinies." These rites, with roots dating back to the early Church, take place during the Sunday Mass, each thematically linked to the Gospel reading for that Mass. The three passages from St. John's Gospel for these Sundays were selected around 500AD as powerful depictions of the hidden transformation God accomplishes in the Elect through each Scrutiny. Each proclamation emphasises repentance and conversion as the Light of Christ comes to pierce the darkness of sin and to bring life where there is death. The "Elect", along with their sponsors, stand before the celebrant and the assembly, who pray for them silently with a series of intercessions.

It culminates in a prayer of cleansing and protection (exorcism) with the laying-on-of-hands. Each Scrutiny is a step in preparing the Elect for the celebration and initiation soon to come at the Easter Vigil. Please pray for Jim and Jordan over the next few weeks.
