THE MEMORIAL OF ST JUSTIN

St Justin (103-165) was born in Palestine, probably of Roman stock. From his youth he was passionate about philosophy, and this led him to become a Christian. He went to Rome and set up his own philosophy school which became a prominent place of engagement with pagan thinkers. When the emperor Marcus Aurelius started a persecution against Christians, Justin was on obvious target. He was martyred with some of his students.

THE MEMORIAL OF ST CHARLES LWANGA AND COMPANIONS

St Charles Lwanga (1860-1886) became a Catholic while serving as major-domo to local king Mwanga in Uganda who had an immoral interest in his young attendants. Several had become Cahtolics and resisted his advances, and St Charles protected them. Infuriated, the king had St Charles and a large group marched out, bound in flammable material, to Namugongo, where they were burnt to death. The youngest was St Kizito, aged twelve. Young Anglicans were also put to death at the same time. Others were martyred between 1885 and 1887.

ONGOING FORMATION

In our Ongoing Formation group we have continued to follow the course 'Introduction to the Bible' by Dr Brant Petrie. We listen to recordings of his lectures and then discuss various points raised. We recently discuss the work of Pope Benedict XV. in his encyclical *Spiritus Paraclitus* (1920) he points out that St. Jerome never questions the fact that the individual authors of the books of the Bible worked in full freedom under the divine afflatus, each of them in accordance with his individual nature and character... In each case Jerome shows us how, in composition, in language, in style and mode of expression, each of them uses his own gifts and powers... If we ask how we are to explain the power and action of God, the principal cause, on the sacred writers, we shall find that St. Jerome in no wise differs from the common teaching of the Catholic Church. For he holds that God, through his grace, illumines the writers mind regarding the particular truth that, "in the person of God," he is to set before men. He holds, moreover, that God moves the writer's will—nay, even impels it—to write; finally, that God abides with him unceasingly, in unique fashion, until his task is accomplished. (Benedict XV, Spiritus Paraclitus 3).
