THE MONTH OF THE SACRED HEART

The Month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart. The Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on the Friday following the second Sunday after Pentecost, this year the Solemnity falls on **Friday 16th of June.** In addition to the liturgical celebration, many devotions are connected with the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Of all devotions, devotion to the Sacred Heart was, and remains, one of the most widespread and popular in the Church.

Understood in the light of the Scriptures, the term "Sacred Heart of Jesus" denotes the entire mystery of Christ, the totality of his being, and his person considered in its most intimate essential: Son of God, uncreated wisdom; infinite charity, principal of the salvation and sanctification of mankind. The "Sacred Heart" is Christ, the Word Incarnate, Saviour, intrinsically containing, in the Spirit, an infinite divine-human love for the Father and for his brothers.

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY (A)

SATURDAY 3RD JUNE

The Liturgy is no place for trying to understand the Trinity: it is where we celebrate in the presence of God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Mystery of One God, Three Persons is outlined beautifully in Jesus' words to Nicodemus: "God sent his Son into the world...so that the world might be saved". We begin and end today's and cery day's liturgy in the name of God who is father Son and Holy Spirit.

MONDAY 5TH JUNE

THE MEMORIAL OF ST BONIFACE

St Boniface (675-754) became a monk at Exeter and in 1719 as a missionary to present-day Germany. With papal support, he re-organised the Church there after a prolonged period of civil unrest and is greatly venerated still today as "The Apostle of the Germans". His workd is considered to have had a consolidating and pacifying effect on the Europe of his day. On a mission to Friesland, he and his fifty-two fellow missionaries were surprised by robbers who put them to death, after St Boniface urged no resistance but to "overcome evil with good."

ONGOING FORMATION

In our Ongoing Formation group we have continued to follow the course 'Introduction to the Bible' by Dr Brant Petrie. We listen to recordings of his lectures and then discuss various points raised. We recently discuss the work of Pope Benedict XV. in his encyclical *Spiritus Paraclitus* (1920) he points out that St. Jerome never questions the fact that the individual authors of the books of the Bible worked in full freedom under the divine afflatus, each of them in accordance with his individual nature and character... In each case Jerome shows us how, in composition, in language, in style and mode of expression, each of them uses his own gifts and powers... If we ask how we are to explain the power and action of God, the principal cause, on the sacred writers, we shall find that St. Jerome in no wise differs from the common teaching of the Catholic Church. For he holds that God, through his grace, illumines the writers mind regarding the particular truth that, "in the person of God," he is to set before men. He holds, moreover, that God moves the writer's will—nay, even impels it—to write; finally, that God abides with him unceasingly, in unique fashion, until his task is accomplished. (Benedict XV, *Spiritus Paraclitus* 3).

Pope Benedict also outlines St Jerome's recommended reading order of the Bible. Begin with the Psalms, then read Solomons Proverbs to learn a way of life, then learn from Ecclesiastes how to trample the world. Then in Job find an example of patient virtue. Then pass to the Gospels, the Acts and the Epistles. Then read the Prophets, then Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy, Joshua and Judges. Then Kings, and Chronicles, Ezra and Esther, then Solomons Canticle of Canticles (Benedict XV, Spiritus Paraclitus 516).
