MONDAY 31ST JULY

THE MEMORIAL OF ST IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA

St Ignatius of Loyola (1491-1556) was born in the Basque country of northern Spain. Ignatius became a soldier and was seriously injured in battle at Pamplona in 1521. It was during his long recuperation that he received the grace of spiritual conversion. He read about the lives of Christ and the saints and realised their worth, compared to the lives of so many people like himself. Such 'discernment of spirits' became an essential element in his Spiritual Exercises, composed 1522-24. Later, at the University of Paris, he and five fellow students took religious vows (the first step in founding the Society of Jesus); in 1539 a special vow was added of total obedience to the people. Ignatius in Rome led the new order. It became a key element in the Counter Reformation and still remains prominent in the education of the young, in foreign missions, in charitable work, in scholarship (and now in providing the Church with its first Jesuit pope!) TUESDAY 1ST AUGUST

THE MEMORIAL OF ST ALPHONSUS LIGUORI

St Alphonsus Liguori (1693-1787) was born near Naples and was talented in the arts of music, painting and poetry. His first choice of career was law but, aged 27, he decided to be a priest. He worked among homeless youth in Naples and in nearby rural areas, became known as a preacher with a simple and direct style and a as a confessor who, although opposing moral laxity, rejected rigorist attitudes, such as Jansenism. In 1732 he founded the Redemptorist Order and in 1762 he was made bishop of the see of Sant' Agata de' Goti. He had a special devotion to Mary, particularly under the title of "Our Lady of Perpetual Succour". Due to ill-health and difficulties for his active work, he resigned from the diocese in 1775 and returned to private life in his order. (Readings: Exodus 33:7-11: Psalm 102: Matthew 13:36-43)

THE MEMORIAL OF ST JOHN MARY VIANNEY

St John Mary Vianney (1786-1859), Priest who had to contend with poverty, military service and his own intellectual shortcomings in order to become a priest. In 1817, he was sent to care for the people of Ars, a small, obscure French village. The marvellous gift of the unlearned priest for seeing into the depths of the soul brought the world to Ars. From 1830 on, the Cure averaged twelve to sixteen hours a day in the confessional. (Readings: Leviticus 23: 1.4-11.15-16.27.34-37; Psalm 80; Matthew 13:54-58)
