Our upcoming meetings will be on Tuesday 24th June and Thursday 18th September at 7-8.30pm at St Mark's parish house: you'll be welcome to come along. Here is the summary: **Bulletin:** the weekly bulletin will be put on parish social media and sent as an announcement via the Parish Community on WhatsApp

Media stories: the Team will write pieces on several recent parish events (Easter Vigil Baptisms; Little Miracles; Brian Quigley's 100th birthday; Holy Communions/Thanksgiving Masses) and send these with accompanying photos to Fontes magazine and/or the Rutherglen Reformer.

Social media: the posting process will be streamlined and we will repost more interesting content from around the wider Church. **Audio/Visual and Livestreaming:** Team members will meet soon to iron out some issues e.g. intermittent blanking of right-hand screen at St Mark's; poor sound levels at the rear of St Mark's; high pitched hum at St Anthony's.

Calendar syncing: we'll try to move towards a shared calendar among parish, schools and Parent Partnerships to avoid clashes. **Outreach to the housebound:** the Team will devise and apply a strategy to help the housebound to install an icon on their device desktop to allow direct access to the parish livestreaming via YouTube.
